Job purpose

The Interim Accompanist is responsible for providing music and choir accompaniment at First Baptist Church rehearsals, Sunday Services and special services. They will be employed on a temporary basis as the church conducts a search for a regular accompanist. They will be eligible to apply for the regular position. The church seeks a candidate that is classically trained and skilled in music performance and interpretation, including a good knowledge of the function of music in the church service and the ability to demonstrate its suitable interpretation. Piano is the primary instrument that a candidate will play. Candidates also proficient on organ will be given special consideration.

Duties and responsibilities

- 1. Provide piano/organ accompaniment for all worship services of the congregation, including:
 - -Preludes, postludes, and offertory music;
 - -Song and hymn accompaniment;
 - -Liturgy accompaniment;
 - -Special music accompaniment; and
 - -Other accompaniment as directed.
- 2. Provide piano/organ accompaniment for rehearsals and services of the adult choir, worship team, seasonal ensembles, and other groups as needed.
- 3. Participate in the Worship Planning Team meetings as requested.
- 4. Maintain a regular schedule of personal practice time.
- 5. Report all needed maintenance of pianos/organs to the Music Minister.
- 6. Additional duties as assigned.
- 7. Be familiar with and abide by FBC Safe Church Policy.
- 8. Be familiar with and abide by FBC Personnel Policy.

Qualifications

- 1. Exhibits spirit of cooperation, showing adaptability and flexibility with church staff and volunteers.
- 2. Supports the FBC mission.
- 3. Classically or formally trained in piano.
- 4. Proficient at sight-reading hymns, choral arrangements, piano scores and organ scores.
- 5. Can play from a lead sheet and chord chart.
- 6. Improvises music well.


